Call for Volunteers for the NEX Research Project

Would you be interested in taking part in a research study?

Our colleague Dr. Catriona Murphy in the School of Nursing and Human Development is seeking volunteers to participate in a research project.

This study will involve testing a combination of 3 technology types, over ten weeks, in your own home. These technologies include a voice-activated assistant (Alexa), a smartwatch and ambient sensors. We are looking for participants who meet the following criteria to take part in the study: — Healthy older adults (aged 60 years or older)

- Lives alone in the greater Dublin area or surrounding counties
- Is a smartphone user and has a broadband connection at home
- Is willing to install the study technology with remote support from researchers

On Friday, April 23rd last we hosted a meeting of the AGU Global Network "Covid 19 - Adapting and Innovating in Age-Friendly Universities". Over 95 registered for the event from our global membership (USA, Canada, South Korea, Czech Republic, Slovenia, the Philippines, UK and Ireland). It was a fantastic opportunity to share learning experiences and innovations relating to our approaches to COVID. It also generated discussion on life beyond COVID. We may not be able to return to exactly what we had before COVID. However, it has presented new

opportunities and bridged geographical barriers, which we hope will lead to greater collaboration between institutions and our AFU participants - watch this space for new things to come.
